Since November 10, 1775, Marine Bands have supported communities and demonstrated the highest qualities musical excellence and patriotism. Marine Forces Reserve Band has continued this legacy since it's establishment on October 1, 1978.

The Band is comprised of 51 active duty Marines stationed aboard the Marine Corps Support Facility in New Orleans, Louisiana. The Band supports the Marine Forces Reserve Major Subordinate Commands, Marine Corps Recruiting and national community relation programs.

The Marine Forces Reserve Band travels throughout the United States, performing for millions of people at more than 300 events annually. Previously supported events/locations including Super Bowl XLVII (New Orleans, Louisiana), Arrowhead Stadium (Kansas City, Missouri), Fleet Week New York (New York City, New York), Pro Football Hall of Fame Parade and Enshrinement Ceremony (Canton, Ohio), Country Music Awards Festival (Nashville, Tennessee), Texas State Fair (Dallas, Texas), Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo (Houston, Texas), and Fiesta Days Celebration (San Antonio, Texas). The Band has also performed abroad in Brazil, Canada, Italy, and Switzerland.

The Marine Forces Reserve Band is located in the historic and culturally rich city of New Orleans where we perform year-round at local events including Carnival and Mardi Gras parades. We take every opportunity to share the spirit of the Big Easy with our audiences.

Captain Panos has led as a Marine Corps Martial Arts Instructor and deployed to Helmand Province, Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. Captain Panos has also served as a Small Ensemble Leader and Trombone Instructor at the Naval School of Music, Virginia. Upon selection to warrant officer, Captain Panos led Marine Band San Diego and 3d Marine Aircraft Wing Band as Officer in Charge directing high-profile events including the Tournament of Roses Parade and Hollywood Christmas Parade.

Captain Panos's awards include Meritorious Service Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (2nd award), Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (4th Award), Navy Unit Commendation, Good Conduct Medal (3rd Award), National Defense Service Medal, Afghanistan Campaign Medal, Global War On Terrorism Service Medal, Navy Sea Service Deployment, and ISAF NATO Medal.

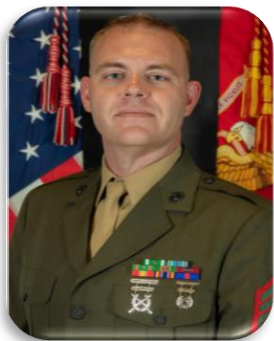

ENSEMBLES

CEREMONIAL BAND

The Ceremonial Band for MFR Band supports parades and ceremonies where a Military Marching Band is required to provide patriotic support. The Ceremonial Band is the most appropriate ensemble to kick off exhibitions or sporting events with the “Star Spangled Banner”. For Parades, it is customary for MFR Band to be positioned at the front of all parades along with the Color Guard.

CONCERT BAND

The MFR Concert Band provides the outstanding dignity and class for community events with a sitting and captive audience. The concert band most commonly supports Independence Day Celebrations, Armed Forces Appreciation events, and Christmas Concerts. Venues typically require audience seating of more than 300 people and require a stage with adequate lighting, sound, visibility, access to AC power, loading entrance and parking. The concert band is best for events requiring music like the National Anthem, Sousa Marches like the “Stars and Stripes Forever”, the Armed Forces Medley and other patriotic music literature.

BRASS/WOODWIND QUINTET CEREMONIES & RETIREMENTS

The Brass and Woodwind quintets are small chamber groups consisting of five to seven musicians. These ensembles are utilized at smaller venues where an event requires pre-serenade music, the National Anthem and Service Songs.



BUGLERS FUNERALS / MEMORIALS

MFR Band can provide a single bugler for Funerals and Memorial services requiring the performance of "Taps" to honor our fallen.

BRASS BAND COMMUNITY AND EDUCATION OUTREACH

The MFR Brass Band is an energetic ensemble that performs upbeat jazz and contemporary music. This group performs a 30-45 min show at schools and public events. The group is lively and encourages audience participation and dancing.

POPULAR MUSIC GROUP JAZZ COMBO FESTIVALS AND RECEPTIONS

The Popular Music Group and Combo perform country, jazz, latin, funk, and other popular styles of music for 1-2 hour shows. Access to adequate staging, sound and lighting reinforcement are required. These Marines are a definite crowd pleaser at Festivals and dinner receptions.

BIG BAND

The Big Band consists of approximately 20 musicians performing classic jazz standards. Big Band plays a variety of jazz to include fast swing, funk, ballades, and patriotic favorites. This energetic ensemble is typically used in conjunction with concerts, recruiting tours, and music education in schools. Most common performances for the Big Band include Independence Day celebrations and Holiday Concerts.

SPONSOR

PLANNING

TRANSPORTATION

All transportation costs must be provided by the sponsor at no cost to the government. MFR Band requires a 60 Passenger Bus with underside storage, a twelve passenger van with storage, and a 16-26 foot loading truck. Sponsor must provide drivers for the reserved bus and loading truck.

MEALS AND LODGING

All meals and lodging costs for 50-60 Marines must be provided by the sponsor at no cost to the government. MFR Band personnel require lodging in safe and secure locations and less than one hour from performance site. Lodging should accommodate 2-3 Marines per room with adequate hygiene facilities. Lodging must have a secure area for instruments and gear with security surveillance. Sponsor will plan three meals a day for the Marine personnel.

PERFORMANCE ATTENDANCE

Sponsor will ensure community attendance for MFR Band performances. Venues with limited seating should be filled to at least 50% capacity. Sponsor must work with local authorities to provide security for shows as well as follow safety guidelines for capacity restrictions.

ADVERTISING

Sponsors can work with schools, military recruiters, and community leaders to promote shows. MFR Band will provide flyers and other promotional templates for sponsors to use for advertising.

VENUE

Sponsor will reserve a venue with appropriate staging, seating, lighting and sound reinforcement. Stages should be at least 40 feet wide and 32 feet deep with no less than eight accessible AV power outlets. Venue must have at least 50 armless chairs for musicians and seating/standing area for attendees. Venue should have basic lighting for musicians to read music and be seen by audience. Sound reinforcement should have two main speakers with microphones for narrator and vocalist. MFR Band may provide extra lighting and sound reinforcement as needed.
